The Old Medical College of Georgia was built in 1835 to serve as the third home of the Medical College of Georgia. This building served MCG through the Civil War until 1913. It was at this location that Crawford W. Long, MD, came at the invitation of Paul Eve, MD, in 1848 to speak to the medical students and faculty about his use of ether as an anesthetic. He was introduced as the “greatest benefactor of suffering humanity.” The building still stands at 598 Telfair Street in Augusta.

There will be a tour of the Old Medical College of Georgia at 8:00 AM Thursday morning. We will meet in the lobby of the Marriott.
